"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." John 3:16

We say it's a golden verse of the Bible. Every time reading it we can find important information for us. God loves the world, he has one and only Son, believers in him aren't separated from eternal life, God doesn't want people to perish and gives them belief.

Now I want to pay attention to the word 'gave'. He is the Creator of everything seen and unseen, he has everything, but before creating the world he had prepared his First and Only to give. Give, so that we will gladly greet each other with the words 'Christ has risen!', so that we can declare to the world 'Christ is our Passover.'

Maybe it didn't hurt him and he wasn't upset? In Mel Gibson's movie 'The passion of the Christ' (2004) stage director was able to show in the moment of Jesus's death, as if the eye in heaven had a tear that fell to the bottom of the cross. There are such words in the novel *«Les Misérables»* by Victor Hugo, - '...one of those large tears which are the somber pearls of the soul welled up slowly in his eyes. He murmured: "That is the proof that God is good."' Hugo called a tear a pearl of the soul.

Lord Jesus knew and was preaching resurrection (reading the Scripture I'm sure about it); it was hard for him to go through the pass of the full dedication. The human logic has a question – how this could be called the strongest love, how precious it is?

In our big family I was a beloved first-born grandson for three grandmas. We lived in my mother's mom's house; on the left, about 25 steps away was the house of my grandma's older sister; on the right, about 50 steps away lived my grandma's younger brother (his wife was my grandma as well). It seems that my strict bringing up was only my mom's vision, and three women and two men (my grandparents) were contesting in love for me. I often recall that I was raised in the paradise© that was not because I was an idler and always had what I wanted; I was working hard as a child and was dreaming about lots of things. That was because I was surrounded by unconditional love. The practice of my grandmas' love contest usually was to give more and more of the best things they had. This tournament lasted through their whole lives. Even when I got married and had kids, I had a pretty good income and was able to help my grandmas, they were always giving me what they had. Sometimes my mom was saying that grandma wasn't right giving out all of her money to the grandchildren and great-grandchildren; she was telling that she has to think about her death and funeral, was asking to start saving money for this. Grandma often during this discussions was opening her wallet and without excessive emotions was giving all the money to me and my kids, answering to my mom: 'You definitely wouldn't leave my dead body in the house, at least you'll bury me under the tree in a backyard, and now I still can give what I have.' In such moments I felt uncomfortable, I didn't need financial help and grandma's pension wasn't very big. Then in my conscience rooted the understanding of us helping and giving not to look good in somebody's eyes, the real reason for giving — is a strong love.

In Exodus, chapters 11 and 12, God is telling that Egyptians will have another plague. He gives advance notice so that every person would ask their close ones for the gold and silver. Through Moses and Aaron gave the Israelites the rules for the Passover offering, tells about the blood that will be the sign for the Angel of Death when Lord will go and slay Egyptian firstborn to get his nation out.

Thinking about some moments that were happening that night thrills me, truly ferocious. 'At midnight the Lord struck down all the firstborn in Egypt, from the firstborn of Pharaoh, who sat on the throne, to the firstborn of the prisoner, who was in the dungeon, and the firstborn of all the livestock as well. Pharaoh and all his officials and all the Egyptians got up during the night, and there was loud wailing in Egypt, for there was not a house without someone dead.' Exodus 12:29-30

By that time all the Israelites were not sleeping, they were standing dressed and shod, with the belts, holding staffs; in a hurry, with the bitter herbs were eating baked lamb whose blood was the sign on the door head and posts. I'm sure they didn't even realize what was happening. Outside in the streets of Egypt the scream was heard, awful mourning. Just imagine, in the beginning it was heard in one or two houses, then, neighbors were lighting the candles to see what has happened and found their firstborns dead. Mourning and yells were becoming stronger. You think the ones that had this grief in their homes were able to give their gold and silver with gratitude and big love? They were giving because of the death fear.

'The Egyptians urged the people to hurry and leave the country. "For otherwise," they said, "we will all die!" ... The Lord had made the Egyptians favorably disposed toward the people, and they gave them what they asked for; so they plundered the Egyptians.' Exodus 12:33,36

In Luke 6:36 Lord Jesus Christ calls us to be merciful like the Heavenly Father. In Exodus 12:36 God gave the favor to his people in the eyes of Egyptians. If looking closer at the meaning of this mercy and that favor, Jesus is talking about compassion and grace and during the exodus seems like God made a favor. I don't want to be given something out of favor. I don't want to give myself for the sake of approval or like Egyptians in coercion, to get rid of the problem. I want to have compassion, mercy and love.

You get into the dark unknown room and you for sure couldn't see who is there and what is happening. That's where more understanding of "be the light to the world" comes. In the second room we found a candle and surroundings became more pleasant. Even though everybody knew that the candle should be put to the highest peak in the room, still this light was very fragile and we were afraid to lose it. Finally, when we found a flashlight in the last room we became more confident.

Deruny (potato pancakes)

Deruny is a dish made of grated potatoes. I want to offer you my recipe. So that they will be very tasty, fluffy and delicate. This is a very simple dish. There are several secrets in making deruny, and as it is said tastes differ.

Ingredients:
Potatoes 700 gr
Onions 2 pcs
Eggs 1 pcs
Some oil
Salt
Pepper



Grate potatoes and onions on the smallest grate and mix so that it will not become dark. It is good to have sort of potatoes that have a huge amount of starch. Deruny taste better with this kind of potatoes. Take the liquid away. Add 1 egg, pepper, salt and mix again. For deruny to keep form, continue to mix the ingredients as each fries, so that starch will be spreading in the mixture and won't fall on the bottom. Fry on a middle heat both sides till it gets brown.

You can add sour cream or fried mushrooms to the ready dish.
